It has been reported and found that the article contains overlapping text sections from another article titled, "Ocular Manifestations of Venomous Snake Bite over a One-year Period in a Tertiary Care Hospital" previously published in pages 256–262, issue 4, vol. 29 of Korean journal of Ophthalmology^[2]. Therefore, on the grounds of duplicity of text, the article in concern is being retracted.
